Our campus is conveniently located at 554 Seymour St. in Vancouver, within steps of everything you may need.





VANCOUVER, BC

Over 100,000 students travel to Vancouver annually for its vibrant, safe, and warm atmosphere. Actually comprised of 21 individual municipalities and one treaty First Nation, Metro Vancouver possesses striking natural beauty and has long been established as one of the world's most creative centres for film and digital screen arts.

Vancouver also offers many recreational benefits, including access to the ocean, mountains, parks and fitness centres, all complemented by a lively arts scene and vibrant nightlife.

DID YOU KNOW...

Vancouver is the largest film hub in Canada and the third-largest in North America behind only LA and New York. Hundreds of film and TV projects are filmed in Vancouver every year.

Other screen-based sectors such as Visual Effects & Animation, Digital Media, and Video Game Design are similarly booming. The 3D animation and visual effects industries are massive in Vancouver, with many Oscar-winning studios including Industrial Light and Magic, Sony Imageworks, and DNEG.

BC'S INDIGENOUS PEOPLE

Comprised of First Nations, Metis, and Inuit peoples, the indigenous communities in Canada hold a unique and important place in the country's history. BC is home to over 200 distinct indigenous nations, each with its own unique culture, language, and tradition. Some have signed treaties outlining land rights and autonomy, while others are still working towards recognizing self-governance.

RESIDENTIAL SCHOOLS

From the 1800s until the mid 1990s, many indigenous children were separated from family and community and forced to attend residential schools. These institutions attempted to erase the traditions and languages of indigenous children and assimilate them into Western culture, resulting in generational harm.

As you settle into your new home, it's important to understand your rights as a tenant.

Landlords are required to provide a written rental agreement and are not allowed to raise rents outside of set annual limits. You also have the right to privacy, meaning a landlord cannot enter your space without notice (except in emergencies) or prevent you from entering your unit. BC also provides a formal arbitration process to resolve conflicts and disputes.

COST OF LIVING

CATEGORY	MONTHLY COST	DETAILS
HOUSING	\$700 to \$2,500	Homestay and shared living options range from \$700 to \$1,500, and studio apartment rentals start around \$1,500.
UTILITIES	\$40 to \$200	Includes mobile phone (\$40 and up), internet (\$25-\$100), and electricity costs (\$40-\$60), although some may be included in rent.
TRANSIT PASS	\$112 to \$202	Single tickets start at \$2.70, with a monthly pass for the longest distances at \$201.55.
FOOD	\$250 to \$750	Expect between \$250-\$450 per month for groceries, and \$15-\$30 per meal at restaurants.
HEALTH INSURANCE	\$0-\$75	BC MSP is free after 3 months of residency. You will require private insurance until then.

DEDICATED LAB T/A


During lab sessions, our teaching assistants are ready to help troubleshoot technical issues, guide you through complex tasks, and offer practical tips drawn from real experience.
